

Tamborine Mountain teams shine in Queensland Wide Pairs tournament

NOVEMBER, 2017 - Tamborine Mountain's Eddie Heinemeyer and David Cowls have achieved a highly significant third place in the Queensland Bridge Association's Queensland Wide Pairs tournament.

The Tamborine Mountain club fielded a total of 17 pairs competed against 676 other pairs from across the State.

Playing East-West, Eddie and David scored a massive 11,995.19 Match Points and a 68.45% result.

Only two pairs, one from East-West and one from North-South, achieved more than 70% throughout the tournament.

Wilhelm Natrop and Wendy Christie, also playing East-West, gained eighth place with a very creditable 11,214.91 Match Points and 64.00% while Peter Morris and Sheena Pollock ranked 40th with 10,291.67 and 58.63%.

Among the North-South pairs, Robert Wales and Wendy Wales gained 59th place with 10,124.50 Match Points and 57.78% and the pair of Denise Merrin and Mary Smith ranked 66th with 9,991.17 Match Points and 57.03%.

The remaining East-West pairings were Julianne Blight and Shirley Gregory, John Youngman and Cheryl Finlayson, Ray Evans and Joanne Evans, Betty Bull and Pam Warrell, Linda Balmer and Walter Flesser and Max Irvine-Brown and Tony Hall.

North-South included Jean Rushbrooke and Ron Rushbrooke, Patrick Rasmussen and Hjordis Braithwaite, Antonia Smith and Marion Howard, Marian Gibbons and Sheila Irvine-Brown, Keith Bowman and Bev Aird and Rene Riseley and Bob Riseley.

A total of 342 pairs competed North-South and 351 East West.
